## ARTrageous Art Show: First-Time Event an Outstanding Success

The Arts Council of Carteret County, in partnership with the Downtown Morehead City Revitalization Committee, held an arts event concurrent with the committee's 3rd Annual Family Boating and In-water Boat Show May 15-16 on the Morehead City waterfront. By all measures, this first-time event for the Arts Council was a rousing success, both in terms of exhibitors as well as sales during the event.

The ARTrageous Show had two primary purposes: One was to showcase our regional artists and provide them with an opportunity to show and sell their art, and the other was to entertain and enrich the thousands of



visitors and families who attended the boat show.

In February our signature art exhibition—Art From The Heart (AFH)—celebrated its 20th year in fine fashion—a record number of artists participating with a record number of artwork, making AFH one of the region's largest art shows. During the course of event, the Arts Council played host to the Chamber of Commerce's Business After Hours, which generated a record number of attendees (nearly 300 business owners and members) for a Chamber indoors event.

In March, our 2nd Annual Spring Bunco Tournament fundraiser was a sell-out almost from the time at which tickets were available. The fundraiser, besides generating much camaraderie among its participants, supports important Arts Council activities.

In May, our 1st Annual ARTrageous Art Show, held in partnership with the Downtown Morehead City Revitalization Committee (DMCRC), provided a showcase for our regional artists and entertainment for the many families who attended the 3rd Annual Family Boating and In-water Boat Show, sponsored by DMCRC. The event was deemed such a success that plans are moving ahead to hold the second ARTrageous show next year during the third week in May.

## ACCC SUMMER ART CAMP

Reservations are now being accepted for the Arts Council's Summer Art Camp 2010. The art camp will hold half-day sessions at the Student Center on the campus of Carteret Community College on **August 9-13, 2010**, from 9 a.m. to 12 noon each day. The purpose of the art camp is to allow students to continue their study of art during the summer and to further develop their creativity and talent through a program designed to stimulate their minds.

Art Camp is limited to 80 participants and open to students ages 11 to 15. The cost is \$95 per student, which covers all art supplies and includes a midday snack. Camp participants will choose one of the following tracks for the entire week:

photography/computer-generated art, drawing/painting, and drama. The last day of the art camp will be dedicated to student presentations concluding with an awards ceremony.

Exhibitors for the ARTrageous event indicated that they would attend another similar show next year. # Record Crowds All Around

## Art From The Heart, Business After Hours

The Arts Council of Carteret County's 20th Annual Art From The Heart show continued to set records for the event, making it one of the region's leading winter art shows. The two-week long event (February 13-27, 2010), housed in the old Shore Décor building in Morehead City, far exceeded previous artist participation and audience attendance numbers, shattering records established in early 2009.

This year's event generated the following:

- Number of artists submitting artwork for exhibition—215.
- Number of pieces of artwork—425.
- Average daily attendance by the public—150+

In addition to the Art From The Heart event, the Chamber of Commerce's Business After Hours was hosted by the Arts Council on February 18, again to a record number of attendees. The Chamber logged in nearly 300 business owners and members, making this networking event the largest attendance indoors ever in that organization's experience. The Business After Hours event was sponsored by Amos Mosquito's Restaurant, caterer to the event; the Carteret Community College Foundation; and Wachovia/Wells Fargo Bank. The Crystal Coast Jazz Society provided an enjoyable jazz music background to the whole affair.



The 2010 Art From The Heart winning artists in two and three dimensional work (non-photography) and in photography are shown below. Charles Sharpe judged the two and three dimension work (non-photography), and Scott Taylor judged the photography entries.

Along with the Art From The Heart event, the 10th Annual Student Art Show was housed in the same

facility and drew a record number of participants—some 1,300 students in grades K-12 from virtually all of the public schools in the county. The purpose of the Student Art Exhibition is to provide a venue for student artists to display their work in a gallery setting and to give the public an opportunity to see a wide range of art work that encompasses the creative ability of students in all grade levels throughout the school system.
